More Than Just Christmas

It seems as if everywhere you look you see Christmas. But there are so many other holidays celebrated in the winter months. Let's take a moment to learn a bit more about two of the more celebrated winter holidays, Hanukkah and Kwanzaa.

Hanukkah, sometimes spelled Chanukah, is the Jewish Festival of the Liahts. It is said that upon ousting the opposing religious leaders from their temple, ancient



Jews found only enough oil to light one night despite that, the lamps stayed lit for eight nights.

Thus, Hanukkah is celebrated for eight nights, and represents the re-dedication of the temple and the triumph of light over darkness.

Kwanzaa is a holiday that

celebrates the African heritage and culture. Started in the late 1960's, it usually their lamps for starts December 26 and runs for 7 days. It is meant to celebrate the "seven principles of Kwanzaa": unity, self-determination, collective work and responsibility,

You can find Jenna at Elders Inn Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 9:00am-5:00pm. Her main focus is personal training, but she will also be leading a few group exercise classes.

More Than Just Speech (Therapy)

Speech Therapy tends to be the least understood of the three disciplines of rehabilitation. In a senior population, Speech Therapy most often treats memory and swallowing issues.

As we age, the muscles in the back of our mouth and throat lose tone and coordination and may not send food and water into the stomach correctly. If material is accidentally sent down to the lungs it is called aspiration and with time

bacteria can breed causing aspiration pneumonia. A Speech Therapist can do a swallow evaluation to



determine which consistency is safest during mealtimes to prevent aspiration. They can also teach compensatory

By Alysa Stanford strategies for memory impairment to make dayto-day activities easier. A Speech Therapist is not able to make a diagnosis of dementia therefore you or your loved one can seek treatment without worrying about a new diagnosis in your medical chart. The Speech Therapist will work closely with your doctor to review any medical, psychological, or neurological tests done to make sure you are getting the most effective treatment.


